

Global HUBs of Christianity Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the purpose of a Global HUB of Christianity?

The overarching purpose of the Global HUBS of Christianity is to mobilize the entire Body of Christ to help plant five million churches for a Billion Soul harvest. Individually, each Global HUB is intended to be a regional center for providing world-class teaching and training for pastors, leaders, and others who want to increase their effectiveness in the harvest field.

2. How does a person register for a HUB?

Registration is accomplished through the local church/ministry that is serving as a HUB. Each HUB church/ministry is encouraged to create a page on its website where individuals can go to register.

3. How much does it cost to register?

Check with the local HUB church/ministry for the exact registration cost.

4. What does an attendee receive for his/her registration fee?

All attendees meet at the HUB four separate times over a two-year period. (The four sessions are approximately six months apart.) In these four sessions, attendees receive face-to-face, world-class instruction of 30 core courses from the Global Church Learning Center (www.gclc.tv). In addition, each person receives a membership to the Global Church Learning Center (valued up to \$1,000 per year) and a Global Church Training Curriculum Guide.

5. How are registration funds used?

Thirty percent of the registration funds remain in the local HUB to help cover costs. The remaining seventy percent of the registration funds are used to open more international HUBs outside of the United States.

6. Where should attendees stay during their HUB training?

Each local HUB is encouraged to provide recommendations for nearby hotels. However, it is the attendee's responsibility to make his/her reservations and cover his/her costs.

7. Is the registered person expected to attend all four training sessions?

Yes. It is understood that exceptions may occur. However, if the person wishes to graduate, he/she will have to explain to the local HUB pastor why a particular session must be missed. Then, the missed teaching will have to be completed online in the Global Church Learning Center.

8. What does the local HUB need to do to get ready for the first session?

- Select a room in your building to serve as the classroom. It should accommodate 50-75 attendees.
- The room needs good lighting, a white board, Internet, worktables and chairs.
- For each day of training, provide a simple lunch onsite for each attendee.
- Promote and market with materials adapted from or provided by Billion Soul (flyers, posters, video, website, etc.).
- Send promotional letters to your members, fellow pastors, and church leaders in your region.
- Promote the program in your church bulletin and on your church website.
- Identify a few local hotels that can be recommended to attendees.

9. Can the local pastor also be one of the trainers?

The local pastor has the choice of either serving as a trainer or participating as a student with the rest of the attendees.
